



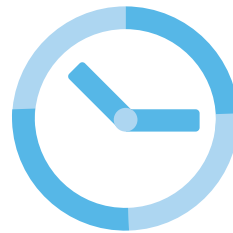
# 2018 YEAR IN REVIEW

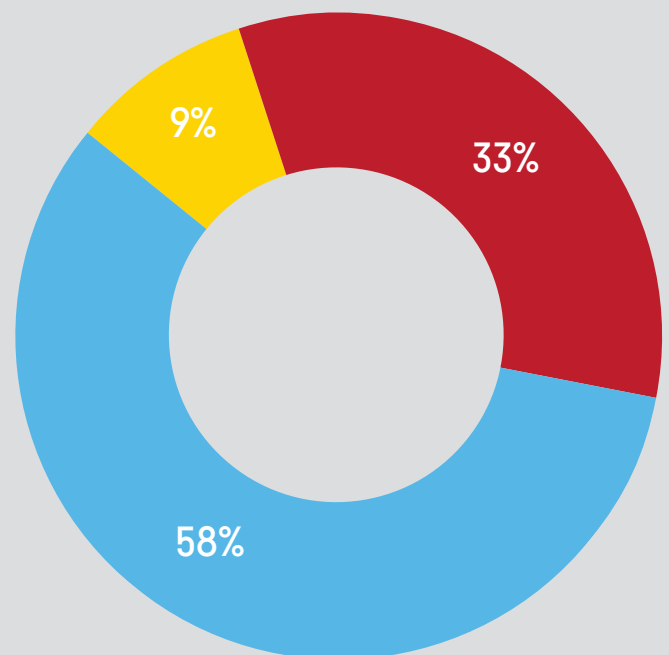
